### Titus 2:1-14 (NASB95)

<sup>1</sup> But as for you, speak the things which are fitting for sound doctrine.

<sup>2</sup> Older men are to be temperate, dignified, sensible, sound in faith, in love, in perseverance.

<sup>3</sup> Older women likewise are to be reverent in their behavior, not malicious gossips nor enslaved to much wine, teaching what is good, <sup>4</sup> so that they may encourage the young women to love their husbands, to love their children, <sup>5</sup> to be sensible, pure, workers at home, kind, being subject to their own husbands, so that the word of God will not be dishonored.

<sup>6</sup> Likewise urge the young men to be sensible ; <sup>7</sup> in all things show yourself to be an example of good deeds, with purity in doctrine, dignified, <sup>8</sup> sound in speech which is beyond reproach, so that the opponent will be put to shame, having nothing bad to say about us.

<sup>9</sup> Urge bondslaves to be subject to their own masters in everything, to be well-pleasing, not argumentative, <sup>10</sup> not pilfering, but showing all good faith so that they will adorn the doctrine of God our Savior in every respect.

<sup>11</sup> For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all men, <sup>12</sup> instructing us to deny ungodliness and worldly desires and to live sensibly, righteously and godly in the present age, <sup>13</sup> looking for the blessed hope and the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior, Christ Jesus, <sup>14</sup> who gave Himself for us to redeem us from every lawless deed, and to purify for Himself a people for His own possession, zealous for good deeds.

**reverent** in their behavior,

### **Proverbs 31:10-31 (NASB95)**

<sup>10</sup> An excellent wife, who can find?

For her worth is far above jewels.

<sup>11</sup> The heart of her husband trusts in her, And he will have no lack of gain. <sup>12</sup> She does him good and not evil All the days of her life.

<sup>13</sup> She looks for wool and flax And works with her hands in delight. <sup>14</sup> She is like merchant ships; She brings her food from afar. <sup>15</sup> She rises also while it is still night And gives food to her household And portions to her maidens.

<sup>16</sup> She considers a field and buys it; From her earnings she plants a vineyard.

<sup>17</sup> She girds herself with strength And makes her arms strong. <sup>18</sup> She senses that her gain is good; Her lamp does not go out at night. <sup>19</sup> She stretches out her hands to the distaff, And her hands grasp the spindle.

<sup>20</sup> She extends her hand to the poor, And she stretches out her hands to the needy.

<sup>21</sup> She is not afraid of the snow for her household, For all her household are clothed with scarlet. <sup>22</sup> She makes coverings for herself; Her clothing is fine linen and purple.

<sup>23</sup> Her husband is known in the gates, When he sits among the elders of the land.

<sup>24</sup> She makes linen garments and sells *them*, And supplies belts to the tradesmen.

<sup>25</sup> Strength and dignity are her clothing, And she smiles at the future. <sup>26</sup> She opens her mouth in wisdom, And the teaching of kindness is on her tongue.

<sup>27</sup> She looks well to the ways of her household, And does not eat the bread of idleness. <sup>28</sup> Her children rise up and bless her; Her husband *also*, and he praises her, *saying*: <sup>29</sup> "Many daughters have done nobly, But you excel them all."

<sup>30</sup> Charm is deceitful and beauty is vain, *But* a woman who fears the LORD, she shall be praised. <sup>31</sup> Give her the product of her hands, And let her works praise her in the gates.
