Daniel 2:1-49 (NASB95)

...you have agreed together to speak lying and corrupt words before me until the situation is changed; therefore **tell me the dream, that I may know that you can declare to me its interpretation.**"

³⁶ "This was **the dream**; now we will tell **its interpretation** before the king.

{Babylon}⇒{Medo-Persia}⇒{Greece}⇒{Rome}⇒{Divine Kingdom}

⁴⁶ Then King Nebuchadnezzar **fell on his face and did homage to Daniel**,

and **gave** orders to **present** to him **an offering and fragrant incense**.

⁴⁷ The king answered Daniel and said, "**Surely your God is a God of gods and a Lord of kings and a revealer of mysteries, since you have been able to reveal this mystery.**"

⁴⁸ Then the king promoted Daniel and **gave him many great gifts**, and he **made him ruler over the whole province of Babylon** and chief prefect over all the wise men of Babylon.

⁴⁹ And Daniel made request of the king, and he appointed Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego over the administration of the province of Babylon, while Daniel was at the king's court.

² The Lord gave Jehoiakim king of Judah into his hand, along with some of the vessels of the house of God; and he brought them to the land of Shinar, to the house of his god, and he brought the vessels into the treasury of his god .

⁵ The king replied to the Chaldeans, "The command from me is firm: if you do not make known to me the dream and its interpretation, you will be torn limb from limb and your houses will be made a rubbish heap.

Daniel 2:12 (NASB95)

¹² Because of this the king became indignant and very furious and gave orders to destroy all the wise men of Babylon.

Daniel 2:46-48 (NASB95)

⁴⁶ Then King Nebuchadnezzar fell on his face and did homage to Daniel, and gave orders to present to him an offering and fragrant incense.

Daniel 3:1 (NASB95)

¹ Nebuchadnezzar the king made an image of gold, the height of which was sixty cubits and its width six cubits; he set it up on the plain of Dura in the province of Babylon.

Daniel 3:4-5 (NASB95)

⁴ Then the herald loudly proclaimed: "To you the command is given, O peoples, nations and *men of every* language, ⁵ that at the moment you hear the sound of the horn, flute, lyre, trigon, psaltery, bagpipe and all kinds of music, you are to fall down and worship the golden image that Nebuchadnezzar the king has set up.

Daniel 3:6 (NASB95)

⁶ "But whoever does not fall down and worship shall immediately be cast into the midst of a furnace of blazing fire."

Daniel 3:13 (NASB95)

¹³ Then Nebuchadnezzar in rage and anger gave orders to bring Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego; then these men were brought before the king.

Daniel 3:19 (NASB95)

¹⁹ Then Nebuchadnezzar was filled with wrath, and his facial expression was altered toward Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego. He answered by giving orders to heat the furnace seven times more than it was usually heated.

Daniel 3:28-29 (NASB95)

²⁸ Nebuchadnezzar responded and said, "Blessed be the God of Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego, who has sent His angel and delivered His servants who put their trust in Him, violating the king's command, and yielded up their bodies so as not to serve or worship any god except their own God. ²⁹ "Therefore I make a decree that any people, nation or tongue that speaks anything offensive against the God of Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego shall be torn limb from limb and their houses reduced to a rubbish heap, inasmuch as there is no other god who is able to deliver in this way."

Daniel 4:1-3 (NASB95)

¹ Nebuchadnezzar the king to all the peoples, nations, and *men of every* language that live in all the earth: "May your peace abound! ² "It has seemed good to me to declare the signs and wonders which the Most High God has done for me. ³ "How great are His signs And how mighty are His wonders!
His kingdom is an everlasting kingdom And His dominion is from generation to generation.

Daniel 4:27 (NASB95)

²⁷ "Therefore, O king, may my advice be pleasing to you: break away now from your sins by *doing* righteousness and from your iniquities by showing mercy to *the* poor, in case there may be a prolonging of your prosperity.'

Daniel 4:29-30 (NASB95)

²⁹ "Twelve months later he was walking on the *roof* of the royal palace of Babylon. ³⁰ "The king reflected and said, 'Is this not Babylon the great, which I myself have built as a royal residence by the might of my power and for the glory of my majesty?'

Daniel 4:34-37 (NASB95)

³⁴ "But at the end of that period, I, Nebuchadnezzar, raised my eyes toward heaven and my reason returned to me, and I blessed the Most High and praised and honored Him who lives forever; For His dominion is an everlasting dominion, And His kingdom *endures* from generation to generation. ³⁵ "All the inhabitants of the earth are accounted as nothing, But He does according to His will in the host of heaven And *among* the inhabitants of earth; And no one can ward off His hand Or say to Him, 'What have You done?' ³⁶ "At that time my reason returned to me. And my majesty and splendor were restored to me for the glory of my kingdom, and my counselors and my nobles began seeking me out; so I was reestablished in my sovereignty , and surpassing greatness was added to me. ³⁷ "Now I, Nebuchadnezzar, praise, exalt and honor the King of heaven, for all His works are true and His ways just, and He is able to humble those who walk in pride."

Exodus 9:27-35 (NASB95)

²⁷ Then Pharaoh sent for Moses and Aaron, and said to them, "I have sinned this time; the LORD is the righteous one, and I and my people are the wicked ones. ²⁸ "Make supplication to the LORD, for there has been enough of God's thunder and hail; and I will let you go, and you shall stay no longer." ²⁹ Moses said to him, "As soon as I go out of the city, I will spread out my hands to the LORD; the thunder will cease and there will be hail no longer, that you may know that the earth is the LORD'S. ³⁰ "But as for you and your servants, I know that you do not yet fear the LORD God." ³¹ (Now the flax and the barley were ruined, for the barley was in the ear and the flax was in bud. ³² But the wheat and the spelt were not ruined, for they *ripen* late.) ³³ So Moses went out of the city from Pharaoh, and spread out his hands to the LORD; and the thunder and the hail ceased, and rain no longer poured on the earth. ³⁴ But when Pharaoh saw that the rain and the hail and the thunder had ceased, he sinned again and hardened his heart, he and his servants. ³⁵ Pharaoh's heart was hardened, and he did not let the sons of Israel go, just as the LORD had spoken through Moses.
