2 Corinthians 2:15-3:6

¹⁵ For we are a fragrance of Christ to God . . . And who is adequate for these things? . . .

⁵ Not that we are adequate in ourselves . . . but our adequacy is from God, . . .

2 Corinthians 4:1-18

⁷ But we have this treasure in earthen vessels,
so that the surpassing greatness of the power will be of God and not from ourselves;

⁸ *we are* afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not despairing; ⁹ persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; ¹⁰ always carrying about in the body the dying of Jesus,
so that the life of Jesus also may be manifested in our body.
